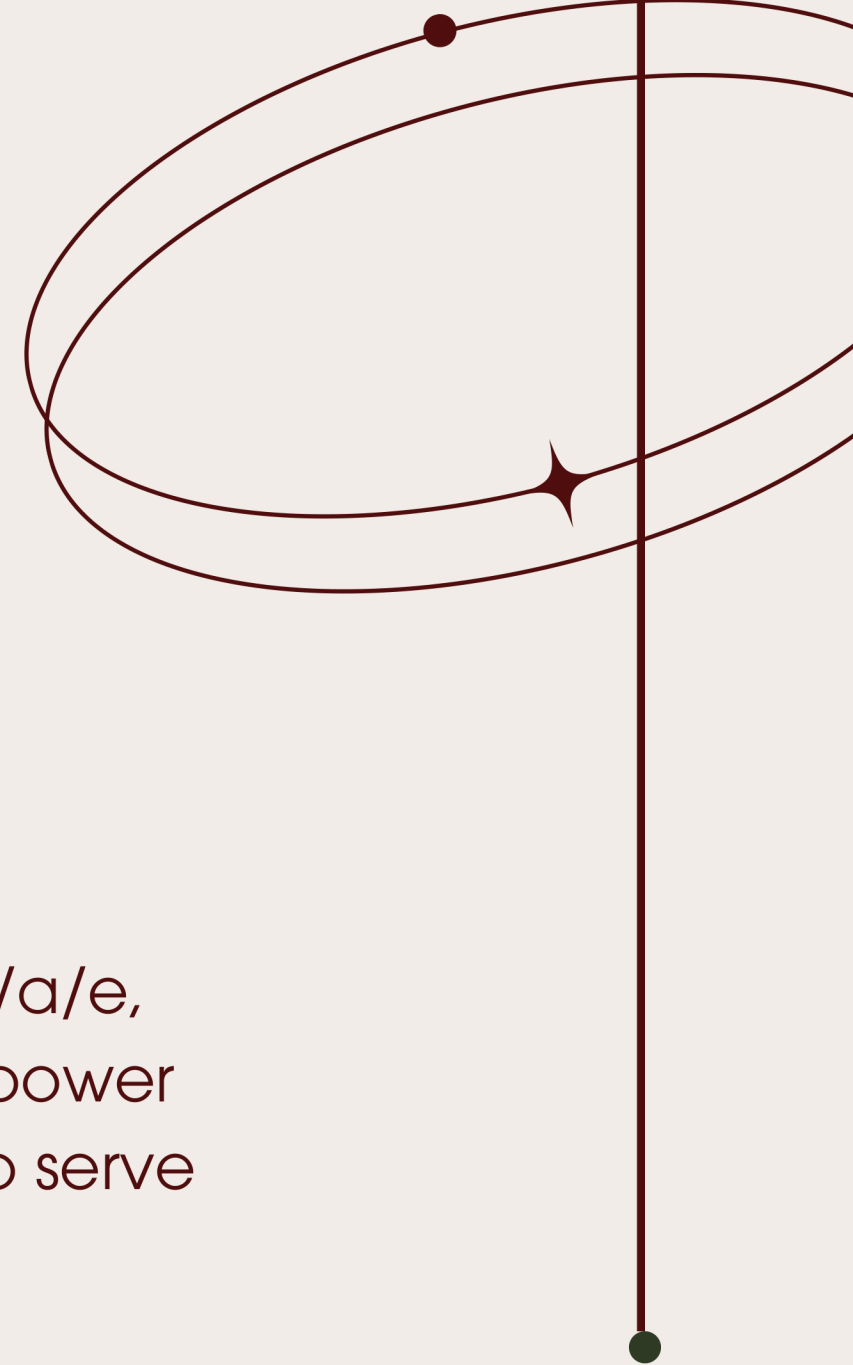

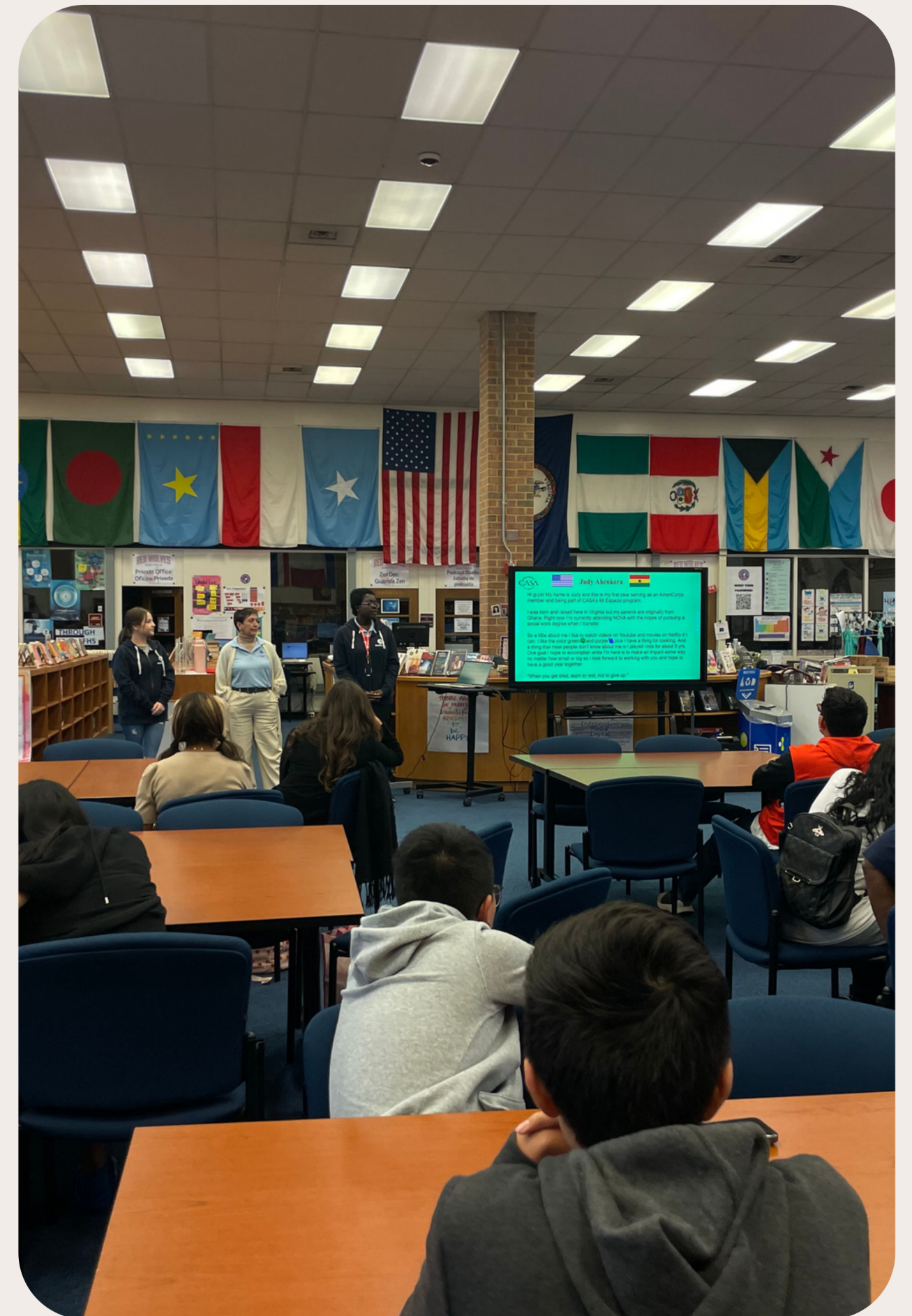
Mi Espacio

ESOL

- The goal of CASA's Life Skills ESOL program is to improve community members' listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills in English so they may become more financially independent, better integrate into U.S. society, and achieve their personal goals. Class materials are geared towards students' life experiences and provide adult learners with the skills to apply English accurately and appropriately in a variety of places including but not limited to home, community, and workplace settings.



ESOL Highlights

- 73% of our students passed our fall two ESOL cycled
- As a result of this program 83% of our students I feel more confident expressing my thoughts and opinions in English

Understanding Transportation Safety Challenges



The problems our members have identified:

1. Traffic congestion
 2. Drivers not respecting speed limits in residential areas.
 3. Lack of walking or biking trails.
 4. Lack of signage for pedestrian crossings.
 5. No pedestrian traffic light or marked path for pedestrians by marketplace
 6. Construction creates heavy traffic and risks for pedestrians
 7. Unfinished / Unfunded projects

Area of focus

- We are currently developing our Climate Portfolio that builds off our safe streets campaign in Prince William County.
 - In the coming months we will be gathering information on what projects have been completed, in construction, or paused because it is not being funded.
 - Our goal is to address the areas that are unsafe & underdeveloped to ensure the county finishes their projects & increase the safety and walkability in the community
 - We are working on ways to enhance the campaign and strengthen the community in Prince William County

The Goals

- To eliminate traffic crashes happening on route 1 and lower the traffic congestion occurring by allocating funds to local public transportation leading to more people using transit option and less traffic on the streets
 - To allocate funds to put crosswalks and pedestrian walk signs where there are none creating safety to residents who are walking to stores that have their apartments nearby.
 - To address families concerns about what is happening in Fred Lynn Middle School because of the lack of pedestrian crosswalk, lights, and high traffic congestion by getting local electeds and transportation to finish traffic projects and insert crosswalks and giving pedestrians a reasonable time to safely cross the street.
 - To insert bike lanes on route 1 allowing pedestrians to choose other options lowering the amount of cars on the road leading to less traffic accidents
 - Address the transportation projects that are being funded by the county and VDOT
